## Red Lidded Bin – Collected Fortnightly

Your red lidded landfill contents are all items that cannot be recycled or composted. Your landfill contents are taken to landfill to be buried.

## What is accepted in the red lidded landfill bin?









- Plastic bags
- **Nappies**
- Plastic wrap
- Hygiene and sanitary items
- Polystyrene (styrofoam)

- Snack food bags
- Ceramic and pottery
- Broken glass
- Toothbrush/paste
- Textiles and rubber

- Plastic/composite toys
- CDs and tapes
- Cigarette (extinguished)

# What is not accepted in the red lidded landfill bin?







- Batteries\*
- Building waste take to your local resource recovery and waste facility
- Gas bottles\*
- Sharps (needles and syringes)
- Cooking/motor oil\*
- Fluorescent bulbs\*
- E-waste\*
- Vehicle part/s tyres\*
- Food and garden organics and recyclables
- Chemicals and poisons\*
- Paints\*
- String/twine
- Cigarette butts (ignited)
- Don't exceed 80kg

#### What is contamination in the red lidded landfill bin?

Any hazardous waste (e.g. batteries), concrete or builders waste are not accepted in the red lidded landfill bin. These items can damage collection trucks, create fires in collection vehicles and put hazardous/or toxic materials into landfill.

\*These materials can be taken to Nammoona CRC for appropriate recycling and special disposal (see more information on page 25).




## Safe disposal of sharps

Please consider your community when disposing of needles and syringes, do NOT throw sharps into your kerbside collection.

Needles and syringes can be disposed of at Casino Hospital ED (sharps container box), Hotham Street, Casino.

(Access via Canterbury st. Bin location: Top of ramp)







#### Bins should be placed 1 metre apart

- 1 metre from any street cars
- 1 metre from trees/fences or signs
- Put out the evening before collection day
- Completely closed, bins will not be collected if the lid is open as protruding objects can damage the truck
- Weight should not exceed 80kg
