Anzac Day closures

Council facilities will close on Tuesday 25 April for the Anzac Day public holiday.

These facilities include our customer service centres at Casino and Evans Head, our waste recovery centres and landfills, libraries, visitor information centres and NRLX.

The facilities will reopen as usual on Wednesday 26 April.

Revocation of bush fire danger period

In accordance with Section 82 of the Rural Fires Act 1997 as amended, the bush fire danger period within the Richmond Valley local government area was revoked from midnight Friday 31 March 2023.

Pursuant to Section 87 of the Rural Fires Act 1997 as amended, fire permits will no longer be required in rural areas for the lighting of fire for the purposes of land clearance or land breaks.

Smoke regulations prohibit burning in some areas. Contact Council or your local fire brigade for further information.

FLOOD RECOVERY WORK CONTINUES ACROSS THE RICHMOND VALLEY

Richmond Valley Council continues to make the repair of flood-damaged infrastructure across the area one of its highest priorities.

Work continues across the region on our roads, drainage and other essential infrastructure with Council continuing to advocate to government for continuing funds for these projects.

Across our region, here is the status of some of the major repair projects recently completed or underway.

Neileys Lagoon Road

Culvert replacement and works have been completed and road reopened.

Busby Flat Road

Causeway replacement is completed.



Bentley Road land slip

Work commenced prior to Easter. Further investigative Upgrading of verge to allow two-lane traffic has been geotechnical testing on the road lane will take place to ensure completed. Design and planning works continue for repair of no further work is required. the landslip.

Richmond Terrace Coraki

Compounds and marking are complete on the site. Weather Richmond Terrace was closed before Easter to complete a permitting, work will commence on block patching, unsealed pavement repair, remix and seal on the area between Allwood roads and verge repairs. and Grenfell Streets.

Tatham Bridge Deep Creek

Council continues to investigate options to replace the bridge over Deep Creek. Structural bridge engineers have advised a weight-limit be placed on the bridge with heavy vehicle diversions in place.

Naughtons Gap

Geotechnical works on-site have been completed, with further off-site testing underway. Council will receive concept designs by the end of April. The project will then go to the market to find a qualified contractor to conduct the work.
