In response to a question on notice from Cr Robert Hayes, Council recently wrote to the head of the Northern Rivers Reconstruction Corporation to advocate for assistance in reopening the Woodburn IGA supermarket.

With other larger businesses in the area receiving considerable government support, Council urged the Reconstruction Corporation to reconsider funding this vital part of the Woodburn community and sought advice on what will advance its recovery further.

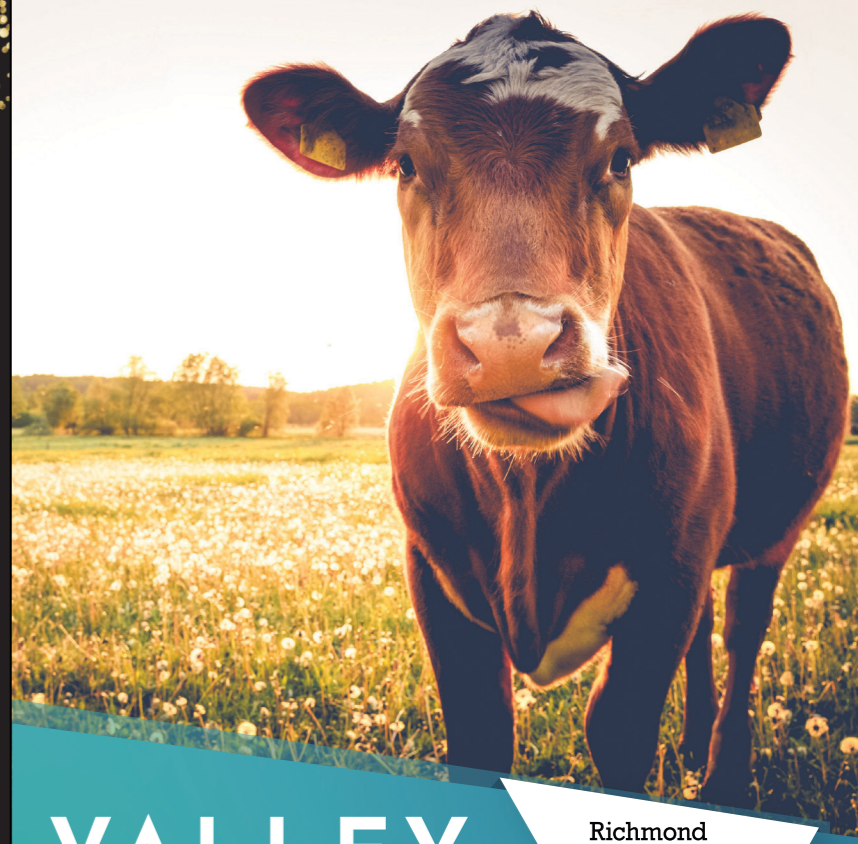

RAPPVILLE RECOVERY

Council continues to work towards the recovery and betterment of the Rappville village. Here are updates on the projects underway:

Rappville sewer

The design for an internal township reticulation system is in the final stages. Council will put this work out for tender this month and will come before Council in the July meeting. On-site work should follow quickly once the tender is resolved.

Rappville shared pathway completion

The design for the connecting piece of pathway is complete and Council is waiting on approval from ARTC for the work including the rail crossing. Council continues to advocate for this approval so the long-awaited work can be completed.

James Lane sinkhole

Council crews are scheduled to begin repair work on the sinkhole in James Lane, which is scheduled for completion this month weather permitting.

Fishing licences available from Evans Head

Recreational anglers can now buy a three-day NSW fishing licence from the Evans Head Visitor Information Centre at 17 Kirkland Court, Evans Head.

The Visitor Information Centre is open 8.30am-4.30pm Monday to Friday, and 9am-1pm Saturday and Sunday.

Make sure to bring along some form of identification, such as a driver's licence or passport, so staff can verify who you are before issuing your fishing permit.

REPAIRING OUR RICHMOND VALLEY ROADS

Tatham Bridges

Final inspection reports have been received for both bridges at Tatham on Casino Coraki Road.

The reports reveal the significant impacts from last year's flood event, and both bridges require load and speed limits.

Heavy vehicles diversions are signposted and listed on livetraffic.com

Temporary repairs are being arranged by Council, and once these measures are complete, it will restore dual lane capacity to the bridges, although speed and load limits will still apply.

Council continues to advocate for government funding to replace both bridges.



Pikapene land slip

Work has been hampered by recent inclement weather, however, excavation of the landslip zone has been completed.

Various-sized rocks will now be placed on the site, with work scheduled to be completed by the end of May, weather permitting.

Manifold Road

Repair work has commenced, though recent inclement weather has caused some delays.

Work is expected to be completed by the end of June weather permitting, and Council thanks residents for their patience while we work across driveways in the area.
