HELP OUR KOALAS

The Northern Rivers Regional Koala Network is excited to announce the Northern Rivers Koala Count will take place from 24 to 30 September.

Counting koalas is hard. They are nocturnal, shy, hard to see among the leaves and branches, mobile, and often distributed widely and thinly across the landscape.

The Network is asking the community to make a special effort to report sightings of koalas during this week on the Friends of the Koala website.

It is also a great opportunity to go for a bushwalk in a natural area, keep your eyes out for koalas and record a sighting.

The week-long project aims to harness the power of citizen science to provide a better understanding about where koalas live and how they use their environment. This can help support important koala research, conservation, and management actions.

WOODBURN CBD UPGRADE MEETING

As part of the community consultation process for the Woodburn CBD streetscape design project, a workshop will be held at 5pm Wednesday 4 October at the Rod 'n Reel Hotel.

Concept plans will be available for the community to view as part of the workshop and community consultation process.

The consultation will help prepare a blueprint for the future of the main street and foreshore areas to revitalise the area and ensure change is approached in a positive and proactive way.

HALSTEAD DRIVE FIX

Work has started on stage one of the Halstead Drive restoration project in Casino.

Stage one consists of clearing up the concrete from the riverbanks and restoring access for the following stages.

Stage two consists of geotechnical assessment, surveys and design, while stage three will see the construction of the new Halstead Drive concrete accessway.

This project is being managed by Council after receiving funding through the Crown Lands Council Grants Flood Recovery Program.

Due to the significance of this project, time-lapse photography equipment will be installed for the duration of the clean-up work. The photography will be strictly limited to the construction site.

Council looks forward to reconstructing this vital piece of community infrastructure and access to the river.



GET READY FOR CASINO POOL OPENING FUN DAY

Get ready to make a big splash as the doors open to the newly upgraded Casino Memorial Swimming Pool on Saturday 23 September.

Entry to the pool complex will be free from 9am, with activities and food available and the official opening at 10am.

The upgrade includes the construction of a new concrete and tiled, eight-lane 50m heated pool with an all-ability access ramp and stairs, a new concrete and tiled, multi-purpose toddlers' splash pool, shade structures, new lighting and new plant room and electrical for the precinct.

The upgrade was made possible with the support of the Australian Government and Richmond Valley Council. The Australian Government contributed \$3.74 million from its Female Facilities and Water Safety Stream Program, with Richmond Valley Council providing the remaining \$2.96 million.





NEW LANDFILL CELL

A new landfill cell at the Nammoona Resource Recovery Facility is in construction, and it will be commissioned early in 2024.

In recent years, Council has transported more than 10,000 tonnes of red bin material to Queensland for disposal each year. Disposing of the material locally will remove the transport costs and reduce Council's carbon footprint.

The money saved will be used to provide more education services to the community to help increase recycling. Landfill space on the Northern Rivers is diminishing, and the new cell gives us more than a decade of disposal capacity.

Securing long-term, red bin material disposal routes is a complex process and Council will continue investigating options through 2024.



EVANS HEAD POOL WORK

The Evans Head Aquatic Centre and its ribbon shade structure are getting a bit of a tidy-up. After 13 years in a coastal environment, the steel structures at the centre showed many areas of corrosion.

MAXCIM, a company specialising in steel recoating, has been engaged to clean, remove the rust and repaint the affected areas on the main roof structure and the ribbon shade structure beside the pool.

This has required the pool to be covered to prevent debris from falling into the pool and significant scaffolding erected to ensure the safety of workers working at heights and over water.

The works are being carried out when the use of the pool is less busy, and it is hoped that work will be completed by the end of this month, ready for the school holidays.



CASINO SHOWGROUND UPGRADE PROGRESS

Construction is well underway for the \$8.2m upgrade of the Casino Showground as work progresses to complete the undercover equestrian arena, stabling complex, day yards, outdoor sand arena, essential services and ancillary infrastructure such as manure bunkers, wash bays and fencing.

Council has completed the upgrades to the sand training track, truck and float parking and improvements to the centre arena.

With the completion of the grass racing track renovation a successful race meeting for the Casino Gold Cup was held on 12 August where an eight-race program had 112 horses hitting the track. The Casino Rodeo & Campdraft Association recently held its annual Casino Campdraft on the newly refurbished centre arena surface where new outdoor lighting had also been completed.

The project is set to be completed in March 2024. The Casino Showground upgrades project has been funded under the Bushfire Local Economic Recovery Fund, co-funded by the Australian and NSW governments.
